Get a work out with the Raiders, climb up and down the hill at Martha Brown.

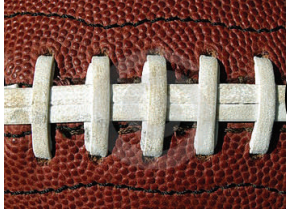
Build those calf muscle, hauling chairs and coolers up the hill. You can't beat the cardio workout!

## Game Day Summaries

### Jr. Midgets vs. Ogden Bears

The Jr. Midgets traveled to Ogden to face the Bears. Fairport's offense moved the ball quickly down field in the first quarter thanks to five-yard and six-yard carries by Alex Frazee and Anthony Bell while the offensive line supplied powerful blocking. Deyon Spencer ran a quarterback keeper for a 55-yard touchdown to take Fairport to an early 6-0 lead. The defense held Ogden with tackles made by Kevin Foskett, Anthony Bell, Alex Frazee, Deyon Spencer and Danny Traver. Second quarter tackles by Madhur Karki and Miles Viniski helped to stall the Bears, but Ogden answered back taking us to halftime all tied up at 6-6. In the third quarter the Red Raiders' defense continued to halt the Bears with tackles by Tim Gaudioso, Tyler Wetzel and a sack by Miles Viniski. Michael Gombetto intercepted an Ogden pass and had a 15-yard return run leading to a series of offensive carries made by Jake Baron and Anthony Bell. Alex Frazee ran the ball past the goal line giving the Jr. Red Raiders a 12-6 lead. Early in the fourth, Fairport's defense held the Bears with tackles by Kevin Foskett, Madhur Karki, Tyler Wetzel, Deyon Spencer and Conor Sheridan. A fumble recovery by Michael Gombetto on Fairport's one yard line kept the Bears from scoring. Late in the fourth, the Bears did score another 7 points. Time ran out as Fairport's offense was building momentum in an exciting offensive series of downs.

Final score: Fairport Jr. Midget Red Raiders 12, Ogden Bears 13.

### Mitey Mite Blue vs Buffalo Ravens & Ogden Bears Orange

The Mitey Blue held determined football teams from Buffalo and Ogden to only 6 first downs and 3 TDs on two consecutive sunny Sundays. The team did not turn the ball over and Nick Schulte and Dominic Gombetto (two recoveries) recovered fumbles on Raider kickoffs. The gang tackling defense has been led by James Merkle, Brandon Shepherd, Tim Chorrman, Owen Viniski, Travis Kinsley, and Anthony Pelletier. Chris Barker and Andrew Keleman have each returned interceptions for TDs and Tyler Knicley also has one interception. On the offensive side of the ball, the high-powered offenses have rushed for over 600 yards on 74 carries and have had scoring drives as long as 65 yards. The Blue Offense, led by quarterback Tyler Kinsley, has scored eight times. Chris Barker and Dominic Gombetto have led the way with 9 rushing TDs between them, and Gombetto, Merkle, and Knicley have also added rushing conversions. The offense has been led by excellent blocking from Devin Marshall, Schulte, Austin Sergeant, Viniski, Chorrman, Steve Bastian, and Andrew Keleman. The White Offense scored their first TD against Ogden and has moved the ball well with very good blocking demonstrated by Bryan Kozciki, Brenden Kartes, Jacob Cretelle, Merkle, Drew Treviso, Jackson Tran, Adam Humphrey, and Tre Jones. The backfield has been led by rushers Jacob Stein, Bastian, and with excellent blocking from fullback Austin Sergeant. Calvin Spiteri returned this week from a finger injury. We were glad to have him back! The Mitey Mite Blue team blocked, tackled, hustled, and tried their best. Great job team! This week the Mitey Blue faces the Rochester Rams.

### Fairport Jr. PeeWee White Edges Ogden on Thrilling Last-Minute Touchdown

Fairport Jr. PeeWee White traveled to Ogden on Sunday, and won a thrilling come from behind victory, 13-12, to even its record at 1-1. Fairport notched its first score early in the game, when Kyle McAvoy connected with Ryan Sheridan for a 15-yard touchdown pass, giving the Raiders a 6-0 lead. Fairport continued to move the ball throughout the first half, as Michael Wolf, Nick Voigt, Bo McDonald, Anthony Large and Jake Ruggeri ran behind strong blocking from Jason Webster, Dominic Macri, Cullen Phipps, Nick McNally, Connor Miller, Chase Paap, and Justin Larson. Several Fairport miscues led to stalled drives, however, and Ogden capitalized, scoring late in the second quarter to tie the game 6-6. Fairport's defense held tough, as Ben Tuyn, Bill Bolia, Steven Carline, Justin Stafford, Darren O'Leary, TJ Edwards and Colin Dake took away the Ogden running game, while cornerbacks Alex Fisher and Tyler Mack provided excellent pass coverage. Ruggeri eventually intercepted an Ogden pass, and Jordan Falk made a touchdown saving tackle deep in Fairport territory to close out the half. The third quarter brought more of the same, as Fairport turned the ball over repeatedly. Ogden again capitalized, scoring to take a 12-6 lead late in the third quarter. Fairport countered, however, as Bolia and Donovan Dey picked up chunks of yards behind the powerful blocking of Jordan Holmes, Ricky Tanner, Dylan Ocorr, Adam Foskett, Voigt, Phipps and Macri. Bolia eventually scored on a four-yard scamper, and added the PAT run to put Fairport up 13-12 with just over two minutes to play. Ogden drove the ball into scoring position late in the game, but the Fairport defense tightened, as Holmes, McAvoy, Foskett and a host of others made big tackles down the stretch to seal the win for Fairport.

### Pee Wee Red vs. Ogden Bears (Final 20-6)

Pee Wee Red went on the road to face the Ogden Bears. Team captains were Luke Trippi, Brandon Brazak, Conrad Brake, and Alexander Pohlson.

The fur flew early as these well matched teams battled for momentum. In Q1, a mishandled punt by Ogden was pounced on by an alert Eli Elvin.

Four plays later Justin Kesselring ran left for a touchdown behind strong blocking by Jason White, Kyle Welch, and Jack Dake. Second quarter action had a long pass by Ogden to set up a game tying score.

PWR defense kept the Bears at bay with great tackling by Christian Rizzolo, Nick Chudyk, and Pohlson. A significant special teams defensive play by PWR resulted in an Ogden 12 yard loss and turnover on downs. With 11 seconds left in Q2, Thibodeau ran right for a touchdown behind blocks of Ben Cook, Craig Hubler, and Brake. Kesselring kicked the extra-points to put the Raiders up 14-6. Thibodeau closed the half with a diving interception. In the third quarter the Bears tried clawing their way back into the game. The PWR defense was able to bend yet not break and stopped a drive on their 6 yard line. Some hard fought offensive yards by Kevin Sheehan and Brazak behind the blocking of Seth Cottengim, Matthew Buss, Nick Sanford, and Austin Albright kept the Raiders moving. At 8:32 in the fourth quarter, Kesselring caught the corner and dashed along the sidelines for an 87 yard touchdown. Strong pass rushing by Jason DuMond, Jack Dake, Rizzolo, Thibodeau, and Kesselring neutralized Ogden's big play attempts. Late in Q4, Sean Mullings had a goal line interception on a clutch 4th down play. Raiders closed their second game in a row without a penalty and took home the victory. Final score: PWR 20 - Ogden 6.

### Mitey Mite Red vs. Hamlin

Mitey Mite Red parents, players, coaches, cheerleaders and all of their families enjoyed a perfect Sunday for football out in the lovely Hamlin countryside this week. MM Red started the game strong on offense with several big-yardage runs but that first drive was halted by a fumble. MM Red's defensive players answered the call, as they would all day, with Matt McGlory turning an acrobatic interception into a touchdown on a spectacular play. The theme continued throughout the first half with MM Red's offense gobbling up huge chunks of yardage with the running of McGlory and Dan Vaughn, and another nice bomb for the second week in a row from McGlory to Rick "don't call me Ricky" Lipinski, but turnovers and penalties continued to put the brakes on several promising drives. MM Red's defense was a brick wall, with Jack Callard, Mike Brown and Connor and Cody Stuewe (fumble recovery) spending the entire day in the Hamlin backfield, and Alexander Mowry and piranhas Sean Farrands and Ryan Smith frustrating the Hamlin offense. In the second half, MM Red's defense continued to shut down any attempts at Hamlin drives, with Jake Polowchak and Andrew Kidd getting into the act on a number of tackles, Tyler Smith causing a fumble and shutting down the outside, and Grant Rodriguez and John Flannery making touchdown saving tackles late in the game. At the same time, MM Red's offensive execution was nearly flawless in the second half, with shotgun centers Anthony Pappano and Matt Cronk jumpstarting the offense with excellent play. Highlights in the second half included a 30-yard receiving touchdown, and a 60-yard rushing touchdown, both by Jay Schwab, who also blocked for his teammates even better than he ran. The big TD plays were a testament to teamwork, with fantastic upfront blocking by Amir Yamout, Matt Cronk, John Flannery, Kyle "the Moose" Musshaven and the entire front 7, and a key block on the outside by Brian Egan. MM Red is showing steady improvement and now has a bye week and 2 full weeks of practice to prepare for the always-tough Greece Chargers.

### Jr. PeeWee Red

On a Sunday Morning in Ogden the Jr. PeeWee Red team took on Ogden Black and it was a slug fest right from the beginning. Strong offensive line play and tough running by the Red Raiders kept them controlling the ball for most of the first half. Ogden was held to limited yardage by a rugged Raiders defense that had to overcome 2 fumbles. Ogden was able to score on a broken play that turned into a mad dash down their sidelines. The half time score was 6-0, Ogden with the lead. The Red Raiders gave up another touchdown in the 3rd quarter on long run to make the score 14 -0. There was no quit on this Sunday and the Raiders were able to punch one in in the early part of the 4th quarter to make the score 14-6. Ogden scored one more time and kicked their second extra point of the day to make the score 22-6. With 5 minutes left in the game the Boys in red could of folded up and gone home but not this team! Pee Wee White played their 1<sup>st</sup> divisional game of the season against the Rochester Rams on Sunday. Fairport's defense came ready to play. On the second play of the game a huge hit by Patrick Mullen caused the Ram's to fumble. The ball was recovered by Matthew Muncey. The offense also came to play. Fairport's offensive line consisting of Tyler Kamp, Marcus Mongeon, Mullen, Zachary Condello, William Fisher, Muncey and James Arao hit the Rams hard and often. They opened up huge holes for Jahadi Prior, Dylan DeLorme and Bryan Dunham to run through. Fairport scores first with a TD run by Dylan DeLorme (6-0). The Rams equalized the score quickly on a broken play which led to a long TD run (6-6). Fairport's offense continued to pound on the Rams with blocking by Matthew Laduca, Dylan Roney, Ray Eichmann and Ryan McLaughlin. The Rams caught a break by intercepting a Fairport pass which they ran back for a TD and conversion (6-13). Another long TD run (6-19) had the Rams winning 19-6. Fairport never gave up behind the strong leadership of QB Connor Riorden and QB Kevin Siegel. A fake punt kept Fairport's drive alive. DeLorme scored his second TD run of the game and the extra point run (13-19). Fairport's defense including Devin Williams, Matthew Johnson, Anthony Giggie, Michael Perlo, Liam Stickle, Justin Gentile, Keegan Kelly and Kyle Schreiner remained solid. A big hit by Alex Fetterman shook up the Rams. Siegel's outstanding hustle got Fairport back the ball by recovering a Ram's fumble with 4 minutes left in the game. Fairport drove 50 yards on a combination of runs and passes. Prior scored on a TD run and received a conversion pass from Siegel (20-19). With a minute left the Rams were shut down by Fairport's defense including Dunham (10 tackles) and Fisher who made the last tackle of the day. Fairport wins 20-19!!!

### Mitey Mite White write up—Fairport vs. Ogden,

The Fairport Mitey Mite White team celebrated their 25-0 victory over the Ogden Bears on Sunday in Ogden. In the first half, both the offense and defense played hard and had great success. Omar Rosa led the first offensive series with a 70 yard run for a touchdown. Also running for the Mitey Mite White team in the first half were Luke Bucci, Jon Catone, and Jack Lindenmuth. The defense pushed hard with a robust showing from Jake Safford, Ryan McEvily, Sam Nix, Luke Bucci, Thomas DeLaus, Omar Rosa, and Jordan O'Connor all working together to take down the Bears. Omar Rosa had another run for his second touchdown in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter.
