### Greece - Apollo Middle School:

- Take 490 W towards Rochester. Take the Mt. Read Blvd exit, Exit 10. Turn Right onto Mt Read Blvd. Turn Left onto Maiden Lane. 750 Maiden Lane is on the Right

### Chili - Memorial Park / Merante Field

- Take 490 West to exit 5 and turn left onto Route 386. Turn right onto Route 33A. The field is on the left-hand side behind the Fire Dept & Recreation Center - There's always a sign out front saying "Chili Lions play here".

### Tenth Ward - Edgerton Park

Take 490W toward Rochester, Take Exit 14 Broad St/Plymouth Ave and continue straight on S. Washington St for less than 0.1 mile. Turn Left on W. Broad St (Rt. 31), then turn a slight left onto Rt. 31 (W. Main St/ Rt33), Turn Right W. Broad (Still Rt. 31) for about 1 mile. Turn Right on Lyell Ave (less than 0.1 mile), Turn Left on Dewey Ave (0.4 mile), Turn Right on Bloss St. (less than 0.2 mile) and turn left on Edgerton Park.

## Game Day Summaries

### Mitey Mite Blue vs Rochester Rams

The Mitey Blue once again dominated their third opponent this season by rushing for over 200 yards and 4 rushing touchdowns by James Merkley (2 TDs), Chris Barker, and Dominic Gombetto and holding their opponent to 4 first downs during the game. Steve Bastian, Merkley, and scored the extra points for the team. Barker also returned a kickoff 60 yards for the Mitey Blue's second TD of the day after a long Ram's score. Dominic Gombetto and Tyler Knicley recovered fumbles on consecutive Raider kickoffs. The gang tackling defense was once again led by Barker, Brandon Shepherd, Tim Chorrman, Owen Viniski, Travis Kinsley, and Anthony Pelletier. On the offensive side of the ball, the high-powered offense rushed 36 carries for 204 total yards, playing the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter with a running clock. The White offense ran 22 plays and the Blue offense ran 14 plays. Both offensive lines get all the credit for the running backs doing so well. They have worked extremely hard during our practices, and the backs are reaping the benefits of all of their hard work and determination. They did an outstanding job blocking throughout the game. Captains Nick Chudyk, Sam Gueli, Sean Bacha, and Jack Dake. PWR hosted the third game of the season and got right to work with an opening series touchdown pass by Sean Mullings to Eli Elvin. A perfect long-snap by Bacha enabled Justin Kesselring to kick the extra points.

PWR defensemen locked horns with the Rams and started backfield havoc with tackles and fumbles by Conrad Brake, Brandon Brazak, Kesselring, and Jason DuMond. Q2 action included a second touchdown pass from Mullings to Elvin with some excellent pass protection from PWR offensive linemen Evan Samuel, Jason White, Kyle Welch, John Scarpelli, Mike Bushart, Bacha and Dake. The Rams rallied back with a couple of touchdowns to keep the game close heading into halftime (16-13). Q3 action had some great up-the-gut running by Christian Rizzolo, Gueli, Brazak, and Elvin as well as outstanding ball handling by QBs Mullings and Kesselring. Elvin added his third touchdown on the day with a 1-yard run off tackle...but he wasn't done. A diving interception by Chudyk set-up a Q4 three-peat touchdown pass from Mullings to Elvin (and TD #4 for Eli Elvin). Big tackles by Kevin Sheehan, DuMond, and Dake stopped the Rams in their tracks and left them scoreless in the second half. Pee Wee White played a divisional game against the Hamlin Hornets on Sunday. Fairport's special teams unit came ready to play. On the opening kick off Michael Perlo foiled the Hornets attempt of an onside kick by falling on the ball at the 50 yard line. Three plays later Jahadi Prior ran the ball into the end zone for a touchdown. QB Kevin Siegel passed the ball to Dylan DeLorme for a successful conversion (7-0). Fairport's defense was just awesome. The Hornets offense had nowhere to go because of huge tackles by James Arao and Matthew Johnson. Zachary Condello's sack forced the Hornets to punt.

The Raider's offensive line was dominating all day behind the blocking of Tyler Kamp, Marcus Mongeon, Patrick Mullen, Condello, William Fisher, Matthew Muncey, Arao, Matthew Laduca, Ray Eichmann and Ryan McLaughlin. This blocking led to a Prior TD run and a Bryan Dunham conversion run (14-0). Fairport's special teams continued to show discipline as on the kick off DeLorme and Dunham stayed in their lanes and out ran the Hornets to recover the football. QB Connor Riorden led the Raiders down the field concluding with a Prior TD run and a Mullen conversion run (21-0). A deep kick off by Siegel with great coverage by special teamers Liam Stickle and Justin Gentile pinned the Hornets deep in their own territory. Fairport's defense got on the scoreboard forcing the Hornets to punt out of their end zone scoring on a safety (23-0). Special teams remained focused as Dunham wisely covered a rare kick off "punt". Siegel scored on a TD run and also converted the extra point kick (31-0). Fairport now turned the game over to its well coached defense. A few big defensive plays included a hard Stickle tackle, a Fisher fumble recovery and a DeLorme interception. The Hornets offense could not gain a yard against the Raiders defense which included Devin Williams, Anthony Giggie, Keegan Kelly, Alex Fetterman and Kyle Schreiner. Michael Wolf, Jacob Ruggeri, Bo McDonald and Anthony Large continued to move the chains for Fairport in the second half, but the Rams countered with another touchdown, closing the gap to 21-20 in the fourth quarter.
