Mitey Mite Blue at Tenth Ward Tigers

offenses combined to rush for well over 300 yards. The Mitey Blue linemen dominated their opponent as they opened holes all day long. Pee Wee White played a non divisional game against Baden Street on Sunday. The Raiders defense came ready to play as they forced a Baden Street turnover on their second play of the game. Fairport's offense quickly took advantage with a TD run by Jahadi Prior (6-0). Baden Street scored on a TD run and kicked the conversion to take the lead (6-8). Possession went back and forth between both teams with a Kevin Siegel interception being a highlight. Baden Street scored again on a TD run but Fairport blocked the kick conversion (6-14). Coach Riorden gave an inspirational half time speech and it showed in the Raiders second half play. Anthony Giggie, Michael Perlo, Dylan DeLorme, Devin Williams, Liam Stickle, Justin Gentile, Alex Fetterman, Matthew Johnson, Keegan Kelly and Kyle Schreiner played tremendous defense. Connor Riorden, Bryan Dunham, Prior and William Fisher pressured Baden's QB with a sack and then forced another fumble. The Raiders offensive line including Tyler Kamp, Marcus Mongeon, Ray Eichman, Matthew LaDuca, Zachary Condello, James Arao, Patrick Mullen and Matthew Muncey lifted up their game in the second half owning the line scrimmage. Prior ran for a TD run and the conversion failed (12-14). Baden Street came back with another TD run but Fairport was able to stop the conversion run (12-20). Prior scored on a TD run and Siegel kicked the 2 point conversion (20-20) to tie the game. Baden Street proved to be a tough competitor as they scored again on a touchdown run and converted their conversion (20-27). Fairport's special teams got on the score board with a Prior kick return for a TD (26-27). The conversion kick to take the lead failed. With 4 minutes remaining in the game Fairport's defensive coaches Stickle and Mullen challenged their defense to get the ball back. The defense did one better and scored 2 points on a safety (28-27). Fairport's offensive coaches Dunham and DeLorme called Prior's number one more time as he scored on a TD run and Dylan DeLorme ran in the 1 pt conversion (35-28) with a 1:40 remaining in the game. Chili contest leaves Raiders with heartburn.

Captains were Kevin Sheehan, Ben Cook, Alexander Pohlson, and Jason DuMond. Q1 was highlighted by defensive plays including outstanding tackles by Eli Elvin, Sean Bacha, Conrad Brake, Nick Chudyk, and Sheehan. A red-zone stance by PWR had an exclamation point tackle by Brandon Brazak to force a turnover on downs. Chili dogged the PWR offense and the quarter ended scoreless. Q2 served up more back and forth action including the teams trading fumbles (with a Brake-Dake goal line take away), a spectacular end-zone punt by Justin Kesselring, and more great tackling by Jack Dake, Christian Rizzolo, Sean Mullings, and Allen Thibodeau. With 1:12 left in the half, Chili scored the game's first touchdown yet PWR special teams blocked the extra-points. Early Q3 action added some spice to the day as Chili cooked up a second TD. PWR came roaring back, peppering Chili with runs by Brazak and Kesselring as well as pass plays by Mullings and Elvin.
