Game Summaries

It was a damp week that ruined cameras but not the spirit of the Jr. Red Raiders.

Here are the game summaries:



Pee Wee Coach Gueli's post game summary summed up the tough fought home game against Southside Cyclones: "We played with big hearts today, and never gave up!" Fairport's first drive of the game resulted in a quick 3 and out. The Cyclones took over after a Fairport punt and marched down the field to score. Josh Halter and Joey Scalise assisted on a tackle that prevented Southside from converting their extra point conversion. The Raider defense led by Halter with 8 tackles & 6 assists came to life after this, and through old fashioned smash mouth football, prevented the Cyclones from reaching the goal line again. Key plays included recovered fumbles by Dan Pariso, and Halter. The Cyclones QB had little time, as Rakim Rutledge, Steven Ricci, and Connor Charron pressured him and each recorded a sack. Strong punting by Dan Pariso led to a battle of field position on the rain soaked fields. Offensively the Raiders had many missed opportunities. A key 31 yard pass from Rutledge to Kyle Pendell allowed the Raiders to drive to the Cyclones goal line in one of their three trips there, but they were held out of the end zone going into the fourth quarter. With the score still 0-6 and into the last minutes of the game, the offensive line comprised of Rutledge, Jon Kresky, Charron, Sam Dovan, Halter, Scalise, & Zak Beutel, took control, and started opening holes for the hard nosed running of Steven Ricci who led the Raiders in rushing. QB Patrick Leg drove the ball to the Cyclones two yard line on a bootleg left, with one minute 40 seconds left in the game. Ricci three seconds later powered in for the tying score. The Raider faithful on the sideline screamed in support as Ricci slammed the extra point conversion in for the believed game winning score, only to discover that the ball did not break the plain. The **Mitey Mite White** "Lightning" traveled to the old "Rock Pile" in Buffalo and faced a tough WNY Bills team in their second game. The final score did not reflect how close this wet and muddy game was contested. The Bills capitalized on missed tackles and slipping defenders on just 3 plays for all their points. Aside from those few miscues the Fairport Red Raiders stood tough. Coach Layer's defense held WNY to no gain or a loss on almost 50% of their plays from scrimmage! Leading on Defense was Dan Masino with at least 7 tackles and a fumble recovery. Dylan DeLorme and Brendan Baker backed Dan up with 11 tackles between them. Sam Gueli tackled well and just missed an INT. Other strong defenders included Rylan Giglia, Marty Sheehan, Mitchell DiSanto, Tommy Posella, Toby Wetzel, Daniel Duncan and Cullen Phipps. The Fairport offense struggled with the inside rush of the Bills and the poor field conditions. Backs Timothy Hoff, Brandon Turner, Dan Masino, Dylan DeLorme had some nice gains but Fairport was not able to sustain many drives. The Mitey Mite White team is prepping for their home opener this Sunday against the Ogden Bears.

Jr. Pee Wee Red dominated the WNY Bills with a 22 – 6 victory in Buffalo. The Raiders' first score of the game was a safety delivered by a powerful defensive line including: Tyler Wetzel, Jake DeLorme, Tim Gaudio, Justin Kesselring, Conor Sheridan, and Brian Dunham. Running back Kevin Sheehan had an impressive run that set the Jr. Pee Wee Red offensive up for their first touchdown when Sean Mullings tossed a perfect spiral to Connor Miller for a 32 yard touchdown pass. Defensive linemen Sean Bacha, Mitchell Hill, Jack Cleary and Trevor Sepp continued to shut down the Bills' offense resulting in a half time score of 8 – 0. The Raiders scored in the initial seconds of the third quarter when Sean Mullings ran a kickoff reception for a 60 yard touchdown run. The extra point was run in by Miles Viniski. The linebackers led by Eli Elvin, Matt Buchbinder, David Grouse and Ryan Wetzel allowed only minimal yardage from the Bills' offense all day. In the fourth quarter the Jr. Pee Wee Red offense lit up the scoreboard one last time when quarterback Sean Mullings threw a 38 yard touchdown pass to Connor Miller. Nick Chudyk ran the ball into the end zone for the extra point. Jr. Pee Wee Red ended any scoring chance the Bills had when Jeff Kenny intercepted a pass to end the game.

Junior PeeWee White 34, Southside 0

The Fairport Junior PeeWee White team, coached by Bill Falk, played its home opener Sunday against the Southside Cyclones, and dominated the game from the opening kickoff. Bryan Ruggeri scored on the second play from scrimmage, running 42 yards behind a crushing block from Kenyon McGahee. McGahee added a touchdown of his own moments later, racing 55 yards to put Fairport up 13-0. Later in the first half, quarterback Ryan Falk found Matt Mooney wide open in the end zone for a seven-yard touchdown pass, giving the Red Raiders a 20-0 halftime lead. In the second half, Mike Pelin scored on a 31-yard touchdown run on Fairport's first play, extending the lead to 27-0. Quarterback Adam Pelusio then directed a 12-play drive, culminating with Zack Barker's 10-yard touchdown run on fourth and goal, to give Fairport a 34-0 lead. Fairport's offense racked up over 200 yards in rushing, with Jamie Wolmering, Will Hart, Tyler Larson, Ronnie Castellano, Danny Traver, Jake Baron, Mooney, Joey Pallato, Cal Fitch, Dominick Volo, Michael Gombetto and Craig Hubler paving the way at the line of scrimmage.

Fairport's defense was equally as impressive, limiting the Cyclones offense to negative yards and failing to give up a first down. Allen Thibodeau led the Red Raiders with seven tackles, while Ruggeri and Barker were credited with five each. The stingy Fairport defense was sharp all day, making several tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Anthony Bell, Deyon Spencer, Shane Spiegel, Alex Palmer, Alex Segnit, Tommy Zona, and Tyler Kamp created great pressure the entire game, while Nick Christidis and Kyle Duca provided steady run support. Baron, Bell, McGahee, Thibodeau, and Volo were acknowledged for big hits.
